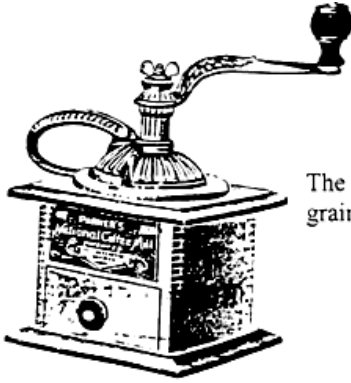
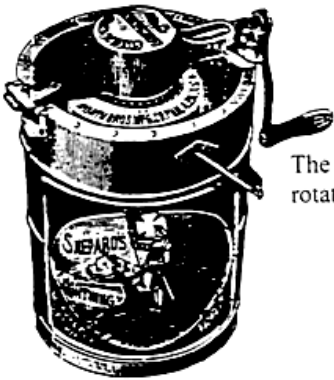


ARTIFACT IDENTIFICATION



The **COFFEE GRINDER** crushed the coffee bean into a granular form. The coffee grains were then taken from the drawer of the grinder and brewed.



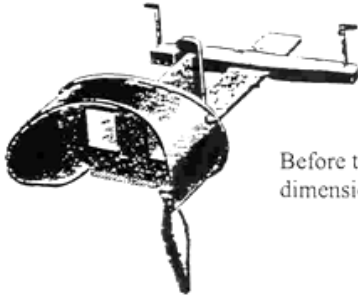
The **ICE CREAM FREEZER** made delicious, cold ice cream by turning the handle and rotating the container of cream in a bucket of salt and ice.

Before television the **STEREOSCOPE** allowed people to see images in three dimensions of far away places or famous events in history.



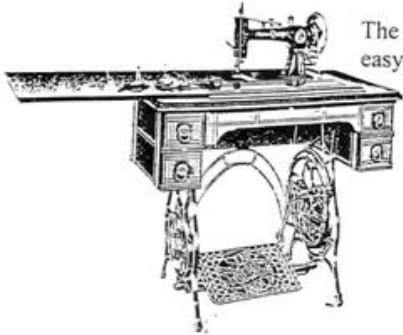

A **WASH BOARD** was used to scrub clothing by hand in a sink or wash tub.



The **PHONOGRAPH** played records and was cranked by hand before houses were equipped with electricity.



The **SEWING MACHINE** was operated by a foot treadle and made stitching fast and easy.



The **WASH STAND** is where the wash basin, soap and towels were kept for washing hands and face.



The **BASIN AND PITCHER** stood on the wash stand and was kept full of water for washing up before mealtime or bedtime.



The **COAL SCUTTLE** stood by the fireplace or stove full of coal to keep the fires hot.
